As often happens in life, the Thursday before the weekend, our new herd of fifteen steers arrived and that was just after the first two Dexter cows established themselves in another paddock. The two Irish girls are part of the new plan. Share-farming is a word that has been in my vocabulary for some time and with great excitement and anticipation we can say that Jay, our sharefarmer is energetically and efficiently working towards planting his first crop of vegetables by the end of February. The small cows will be used to graze the area, followed by the pigs and finally the chooks. These animals will all contribute their manurer and soil turning to allow this farm to continue on its journey of organic sustainability and to use inputs that are already on-farm.

Finally, I want to flag the Kenilworth Food and Wine show which will be held on Saturday, 30th March which is during Easter. This is an opportunity to see what local producers are doing in this area as well as supporting them by buying their product.
